3. What was the earliest form of voting in America? How has the way we vote changed over the years? What do you think voting will look like 20 years from now?
4. What purpose do party symbols serve? What was the first widespread use of a slogan and party imagery in a presidential campaign?
5. How were songs and hymns used during the Civil Rights Movement? How have songs been used in political campaigns? Are songs an effective way of communicating ideas? Why or why not?
6. What role did a dairy pail play in helping to keep Salisbury residents safe?
7. What are some functions of Salisbury University's Institute for Public Affairs and Civic Engagement (PACE)?
8. What story or artifact did you find most compelling in the exhibit? Why?
