D. Professional Program Admission Requirements

- 1) A GPA of 2.5 or higher in the pre-professional core courses (Part A&B) is required for admission into the Professional Program, including those courses taken at another institution. A GPA calculator is available at: https://www.salisbury.edu/academic-offices/advising-center/files/gpa-calculator-pre-professional.xlsx?v=20250613220241
- 2) Grades of C or higher must be earned in all pre-professional courses for the Business *Economics major*.
- 3) Grades of C or higher must be earned in ACCT 201, ACCT 202 and ACCT 248 for the **Accounting major**.
- 4) Students must have completed **40 total credit hours** of college courses to be admitted into the Professional Program.
- 5) All 11 Pre-Professional Courses must be completed.
- 6) Complete at least 9 out of 11 Pre-Professional Courses (26 credits) to be admitted to the professional program:
 - a. 5 of which must be ACCT 201, BUAD 200, MATH 155, MATH 160, and ECON 211 or ECON 212,
 - b. The remaining 2 courses must be completed in the first semester after being admitted to the Professional Program
- 7) Students may **repeat each business course one time only**. If students exceed repeats, they will not be admissible to the Professional Program.
