Salisbury University minors require:

- The completion of at least 18 credits with grades of C or better.
- At least 15 credits applied toward the minor must be coursework that is not used to satisfy General Education requirements.
- At least nine credits must be earned at SU.

Advisement for the minor is available from the English Department.

MINOR REQUIREMENTS

- The minor requires 4 courses, each completed with a grade of C or better beyond the courses used to fulfill General Education requirements (ENGL 103 with a C or better and the General Education literature course).
- Students may not use courses to satisfy requirements in multiple English minors and/or major programs of study.
