UNIVERSITY POLICIES

Salisbury University minors require:

- The completion of at least 18 credits with grades of C or better.
- At least 15 credits applied toward the minor must be coursework that is not used to satisfy General Education requirements.
- At least nine credits must be earned at SU.

Advisement for the minor is available from the Interdisciplinary Studies Program or Political Science Department.

MINOR REQUIREMENTS

- For the experiential/internship area, students must enroll in 4 credits (3 for CADR 400) and work with the minor coordinator and the appropriate department chair to develop an internship relevant to the minor.
- 3 of the 5 courses must be from different disciplines.
- Grades of C or better are required in all courses applicable to the minor.
