If you are **motivated by creating a safer, more just world**, a career in the areas of social justice, politics or peace might be for you.

The conflict analysis and dispute resolution major is the No. 2 degree program in the nation for conflict resolution, according to rankings recently published by Schools.com. It also is home to the **Bosserman Center for Conflict Resolution**, which has hosts internationally known experts – prime ministers, former presidents, cultural and religious leaders, and important historical figures.



All of SU's undergraduate and graduate social work programs are **fully accredited** by the Council of Social Work Education, a must for earning licensure, and focus on anti-racist and anti-oppressive teaching, service and scholarship.

SU's **Institute for Public Affairs and Civic Engagement** gives students exposure and access to public affairs leaders and professional development opportunities that give them an edge in pursuing their career goals.



Students studying in **social justice, politics and peace** areas secure jobs as elected officials, conflict mediators, lawyers, victim advocates, law enforcement investigation, historians, history educators and many other areas.

In a recent survey, SU graduates were **hired by organizations** such as the Office of the Public Defender of the State of Maryland, General Dynamics, the Immigrant Justice Corps, the Maryland Division of Parole and Probation, the Worcester County Board of Education, and the office of a U.S. senator.



Students also chose to **attend graduate school** at institutions like the University of London, University of North Carolina – Greensboro, The New School of Public Engagement, Trinity College – Dublin and the University of Maryland School of Law.
