Distinctive Difference

Salisbury University has been transformed by its quest for academic excellence. From its humble beginnings as a school for teachers, and later a relaxed regional college by the beach, in the last two decades, SU has launched itself into regional prominence as a powerhouse academic institution.

Over the last 15 years, the University has doubled in size, become a top producer of Fulbright faculty and been designated by the National Science Foundation (NSF) as a center for undergraduate research. Opening in fall 2016, the Guerrieri Academic Commons library facility will be the largest academic building in SU's history and will change the face of learning on campus. SU attracts some of the best students in the region. SU boasts the highest four-year and six-year graduation rate and fastest time-to-degree completion of any of the comprehensive universities in the University of Maryland System.

Experience Excellence And Value

Salisbury University delivers a superb education at a great value. For well over a decade, SU has been among the *U.S. News & World Report's* and *Princeton Review's* Best Colleges. Since 2008, SU has been recognized among *Kiplinger's Personal Finance* magazine's "100 Best Value Public Colleges" and in 2013 was named to the top 25 list of "Best College Values Under \$30,000." *Kiplinger's* applauded SU's "high four-year graduation rate, low average student debt at graduation, abundant financial aid, low sticker price, and overall value." SU also was listed in the *Princeton Review's* "Top 80 Best Values in Public Colleges," which noted its "stellar academic programs coupled with the benefits of a state school price tag."

Four Schools – A Million Opportunities

Perdue School of Business

- Perdue Hall, home of the Eastern Shore's premier center for entrepreneurship, features some \$3.1 million in new technology and is LEED gold certified.
- In 2015, the annual Perdue Entrepreneurship competition had a prize pool of \$100,000 in start-up capital for students with the best new business proposals.
- In 2015, the Perdue School served as one of the national host locations for ABC's *Shark Tank* for the second year.
- It is among only 5 percent of business schools world-wide to be AACSB accredited, and its American Marketing Association chapter has been named one of the top 20 in the country.

Seidel School of Educational and Professional Studies

- SU has produced over 40 Maryland Teachers of the Year since 2003, including two statewide winners.
- Education has received three national awards for its leadership in professional development schools.
- SU offers the only accredited exercise science program in Maryland, featuring built-in internships.
- The Social Work Department offers B.S.W. and M.S.W. programs across the state and in Europe.

Fulton School of Liberal Arts

- The school features an innovative four-credit curriculum, which provides academic and experiential "enhancements" to courses in the humanities, social sciences and fine arts.
- SU is one of only two schools nationally to offer both an undergraduate and graduate degree in conflict analysis and dispute resolution and has the only approved "hot glass" art concentration within the state.
- Named one of *The Princeton Review's* "Great Schools for Communication Majors," SU has an 18,500 square foot Integrated Media Center for media and music production.
- The school's newest department in environmental studies has produced multiple Environmental Protection Agency Fellowship winners.

Henson School of Science and Technology

- The largest of the four SU schools, Henson develops leaders for science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) and health science fields.
- The school's focus on undergraduate research, including National Science Foundation summer research opportunities, has helped a recent student secure a coveted Gates-Cambridge Fellowship.
- SU's nursing program is widely regarded as one of the best in the region and our graduates have the highest pass rates in the University System of Maryland on the national nursing certification exams (NCLEX).
- SU offers a Medical Simulation Center and a host of research opportunities both internationally and throughout the natural laboratory of the Delmarva Peninsula.

Transfer Scholarships

- Salisbury University PTK Scholarship Scholarships are available to Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society members who transfer to SU for a fall term. The selection is competitive; awards range from \$2,000-\$3,000 per year, depending on residency, and are renewable for a total of two years. To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must have earned an associate's degree or completed a minimum of 60 transferable hours, have a GPA of at least 3.5 and be applying to SU directly from community college. The program application deadline is April 1. In addition to academic profile, leadership roles and community service will also be considered in evaluating scholarship applications.

Admission Criteria

Prospective transfer students are admissible to Salisbury University based upon the completion of:

- 24 semester hours of transferable college coursework at regionally accredited institutions
- good standing in the community and at the institution most recently attended
- a cumulative 2.0 grade point average (GPA) in all credits previously attempted (using a GPA maximum of 4.0)

Transfer students with a minimum of 24 transferable credits and 2.0 grade point average are considered for admission.

Contractual admission is extended to students who have earned between 12 and 23 transferable credits and are currently enrolled in coursework, provided the above criteria is met. Fall applicants receiving an offer of contractual admission must earn 24 transferable credits by the completion of the previous spring term and at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA. Spring applicants receiving an offer of contractual admission must earn 24 transferable credits by the completion of the previous fall term and at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA.

Students who have earned an associate's degree (A.A., A.S., A.A.S. or A.A.T.) in a transferable program from a Maryland community college are admissible to the University. Individuals who have attended other colleges or universities after receiving an associate's degree must be in good standing at the institution most recently attended and have a 2.0 GPA in all credits previously attempted (using a GPA maximum of 4.0). Individuals who have received a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution are also admissible as second-degree students.

Applications are reviewed on a space-available basis. An applicant who has submitted all required documentation by the priority transfer application deadline receives the best consideration for admission. A completed transfer application includes the submission of the online application and the receipt of official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.

Application Procedures

Prospective transfer students must:

- submit an online Salisbury University Admissions Application
- pay a \$50 non-refundable application fee
- have official transcripts for all previously attended colleges and universities sent to the Office of Admissions (regardless of whether or not credit was earned, is desired or is transferable)

Transfer Credit Evaluation

An evaluation of transfer credit is completed for each applicant through the admissions process. A maximum of 90 credit hours from four-year institutions, 64 credit hours from two-year institutions (a combination of four-year and two-year may not exceed 90 credit hours), may be applied to the 120 credit hour minimum required for graduation. Transfer credit evaluations are made available to applicants after an offer of admission has been made. Applicants will have an opportunity to review their transfer credit evaluations before he or she must commit to the University by paying an admission deposit.
