The Maryland State Normal School at Salisbury held its first annual commencement on campus on June 7, 1926, after several days of events: a patriotic pageant, Class Day exercises, a junior-senior picnic at the Nanticoke River, the reception of graduates into the Alumni Association, and a religious service for seniors. The class motto was "Not Sunset, But Dawn" and its colors were old rose and silver, while its flower was the sweet pea. The 21 graduates hailed from Wicomico County (7), Dorchester County (6), Worcester County (5), Somerset County (1), Kent County (1), and Virginia (1).
