Prepping for Grad School/Professional Tests

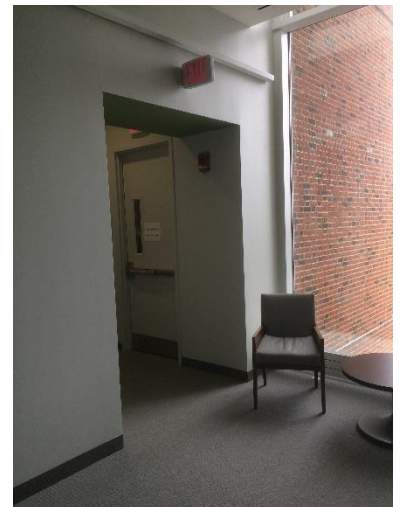


Are you planning on taking the GRE, LSAT, MCAT, or other grad school admissions tests? Or will you be taking a professional certification exam, such as the ASWB, NCLEX, or Praxis®? Thanks to SU's Career Center, all SU students have access to *PrepSTEP® Learning Express for Colleges*,

which provides practice tests and in some cases tutorials for these and many other tests. It also provides tutorials for academic success skills, such as notetaking and communicating with professors. You will find *PrepSTEP®* on the "Databases" tab on the Libraries' home page. If you want even more practice, the Wicomico Public Libraries provide online access to *Gale Presents: Peterson's Test and Career Prep*. You must have a WPL borrower's card to use that database, but anyone with an SU ID card is eligible to get one. Alternatively, the public library in your home county probably has access to *Gale Presents* or *Mometrix*, which is another test preparation database.

Fire Exits in the GAC

You probably weren't here on December 20, when a fire filled Blackwell with smoke, and the building needed to be evacuated. The *Privy's* editor wants to remind people where the emergency exit stairs are in the GAC. They are in the four corners of the central core of the building, not the corners of the whole building. On the Red Square side, the locations of the doors vary a little bit, but they are always just off the atrium. On the parking lot side, enter the stairs near the windows past the restrooms. The Center for Student Achievement and the Office of Instructional Design & Delivery have additional doors to the emergency exit stairs. If the fire alarm goes off, head for the nearest exit and get out of the building!
