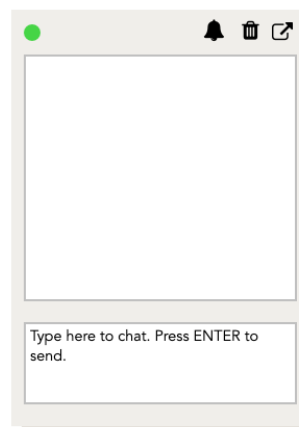

It's also integrated into MyClasses—just look for “Library Chat” in the sidebar. This service is perfect for getting research assistance, learning about library services, or asking any question that comes to mind.

Did You Know? The library has many of your course materials on Course Reserve at the service desk to help relieve you of the financial burden of purchasing them all. Professors set aside books, DVDs, and even personal textbooks for shared student access. Reserves are typically checked out for 2-3 hours and are only usable in the GAC.
